An Extract from the Homily of Pope Benedict at, Regensburg 12 September 2006 ... We believe in God.... Today, when we have learned to recognize the pathologies and the life-threatening diseases associated with religion and reason, and the ways that God's image can be destroyed by hatred and fanaticism, it is important to state clearly the God in whom we believe, and to proclaim confidently that this God has a human face. Only this God saves us from being afraid of the world and from anxiety before the emptiness of life. Only by looking to Jesus Christ does our joy in God come to fulfilment and become redeemed joy. During this solemn Eucharistic celebration. let us look to the Lord lifted up before us on the Cross and ask him to give us the immense joy which, at the hour of his farewell. he promised to the disciples (cf. Jn 16:24)!

from reports on the Church in China

"Blessed are they who are persecuted.." It seems not a little ironic that many of the religious goods that we readily purchase, as well as candles, and nativity sets, are made in China. On the other hand there is little religious freedom within China e.g. In September two priests were arrested three hours after arriving back at Shenzhen in the southern province. The police took away a large number of books and photos that the priests brought back from Europe and Rome. No reasons were given for their arrest. Both Father Saho and Father Jiang were arrested on Oct. 27, 2005 after they concelebrated Mass with other priests to close the Eucharistic Year proclaimed by the Pope John Paul II. Father Shao was also arrested in 1999 and later released. Father Jiang was detained in 1999 for publishing hymn books, sentenced to a six-year jail term, and fined the equivalent of \$32,000. He was released in 2003. There are thought to be at least 12 Bishops in Chinese prisons and many priests.
